Martha 'Mattie' Boylan was born in 1873 in Stockton, Kansas, USA to Mary Alldredge and George Boylan and was the third of nine children. In 1880, Martha and her family travelled from Kansas, by wagon train, on the Oregon Trail and settled in Clackamas County, Oregon. Martha married Benjamin 'Matt' Doolittle on October 26th, 1893 in Clackamas County. The couple welcomed a son, Edmund in 1898.

In November 1911, Benjamin left his job as mechanic at the Clark County Saw Mill in Washington, and travelled with his family to White Rock, British Columbia. From here, the Doolittle Family made their way to Powell River for Benjamin to start as master mechanic with the Powell River Company's Pulp and Paper Mill.

By 1930, the family had returned to the United States, and eventually settled on a farm in Tillamook, Oregon.
