Sailors & Settlers

Grades 3-4

Topics: 1790s-1850s regional history, Indigenous, explorer, and fur trading accounts.

Learning Goals: Students will increase familiarity and comfort with being in the museum. They will also learn about local links to fur trade, map-making, hunting, and fishing history.

Curriculum links: Grade 3 Social Studies (Indigenous peoples), Grade 4 Social Studies (Indigenous peoples and European exploration)

- gain familiarity with using map symbols
- learn about different Coast Salish tools and items excavated through archaeology
 - additionally learn about different hunting and fishing techniques used by Coast Salish people and settlers
- relocation of Indigenous people after colonization
- gold rush and fur trade history
 - James Cook
 - Cariboo Gold Rush

What to expect:

Come to the museum ready for

1. a short classroom learning session
2. indoor and/or outdoor activities
3. discussion and sharing ideas

Come prepared with

1. clothing and footwear appropriate for indoor activities
2. students pre-divided into four (4) teams
3. a quick snack for each student (optional)
4. money for the gift shop (optional)

Activities:

- a short classroom learning session
 - we will lead an artifact round robin, guessing what different mystery artifacts are
- a hands-on activity
 - scavenger hunt and orienteering activity
